Grant No.9

Assam state Transport Corporation

Assam State Transport Corporation was constituted under Road Transport Corporation Act 1950 with effect from 31st March 1970. Before christened as a Corporation, it was a wing of Transport Department of Government of Assam. It came to effect from 16th January 1948 as "Road Transport, Assam" under Home Department. In the early part of 1950, it was transferred to Transport Department of Government of Assam. It continued as such till it became a Corporation with effect from 31st March 1970.

The Road Transport Corporations Act. 1950 has been extended to the State of Assam with effect from 10th March. 1970 and Assam State Road Transport Corporation was constituted by Government of Assam under the said Act, which took over the management of the departmental undertaking "State Transport, Assam" with effect from 31st March, 1970. Since inception this Corporation has been playing a major role in the passenger transportation sector in north east India.

ASTC, the facilitator of public transport in the State is committed to providing effective and efficient services to citizens through several ongoing initiatives for transformation of internal governance, infrastructure, IT enabled services and accessibility.

COMMISSION ERA TE OF TRANSPORT:-

The Commissionerate of Transport, Assam has set the target of M. V revenue collection for the year 2021-22 at Rs.I061.00 Crores. Out of which an amount of Rs.836.62 Cr. has been collected by way of Taxes, fees and fines up to February 2022, whereas in the F.Y. 2020-21 (upto February 2020) an amount of Rs. 632.30 Cr. was collected. As per data, revenue collection in the current financial year, i.e. 2021-22 (upto February, 2022) is increased by 32.31% in comparison to the corresponding period of the previous financial year i.e. 2020-21 (upto February, 2020).

In addition the Commissionerate of Transport, Assam has been focusing more emphasis on improvement of road safety in the State by effective implementation of road safety measures through enforcement of Law, road safety awareness and education programs etc.

The Commissioner of Transport, Assam has taken up the following works/ projects/ schemes:-

- i. 13Faceless and contactless services under vahan and sarathi portal for citizens have already been launched. Remaining IO more contactless services will be launched in a phased manner within May-2022.
- ii. Hon'ble Chief Minister's Covid Relief Scheme for Drivers, Handyman and Conductors of inter district passenger buses is being implemented and the payment of relief towards Drivers, Handyman and Conductors is in process.
- iii. Training of Drivers and Issuance of Driving License post Training.

The department with an aim to create a cadre of trained drivers, launched a scheme under which 50 youths from each Legislative Constituency. The beneficiaries have been identified and the training has been started in certain districts already.

iv. IEC Activities:

Extensive Awareness and sensitization campaign was carried out to generate sensitization on the issues related to Road Safety. The districts have carried out a series of activities based on the guideline for IEC activities provided by the department. The department also carried out various set of activities

- v. Social media campaign/ print and electronic media campaign on road safety.
- vi. Setting up of Grievance Redressal Cell.
- vii. Electronic monitoring and enforcement of MV Act & Rules by way of utilizing road safety equipments and traffic interceptor vehicles.

DIRECTORATE OF INLAND WATER TRANSPORT:

The water transport of Assam has been controlled and maintained by the Directorate of IWT, Assam, under Transport Department, Govt. of Assam and mostly concentrated with passenger ferry & cargo transportation services on the river Brahmaputra, Barak and in its tributaries. Additionally the IWT Assam playing an important role for development of River Tourism with the services of river cruising facility as well as floating restaurants

Ferry Service: At present IWT Assam is operating 96 (one hundred one) Passengers ferry services throughout Assam out of which 71 (seventy eighty) at Brahmaputra valley and 25 (twenty three) at Barak valley. Additionally, IWT Assam is operating commercial services with hiring-out of existing commercial vessels to private operators for cargo transportation and earning revenue for the State.

Crew Training Centre: The Crew Training Institute was established at Guwahati which provides Competency Certificates to in-service personnel of IWT Deptt. and other allied organization of N.E. Region both public & private sector after conducting written examination centrally as well as provides maritime training to fresh candidates.

River Conservancy: IWT Assam has its own river conservancy wing for maintaining proper Navigability of the river route to ensure smooth operation ferry services.

Now-Casting: IWT Assam has been received weather report from India Metrological Department, Borjhar and set-up one State Control Room at IWT Head Quarter Guwahati and five control rooms at Dhubri, Dibrugarh, Silchar, Goalpara & Jorhat to distribute this Now Cast

information to maintain safety on IWT ferry operation at different services.

River Tourism: Beautification of river bank at Guwahati including River Cruising service at Guwahati both A.C & Non-A/C vessels operated under IWT Assam.

Significant achievements during 2021-22:

Schemes under SOPD: The IWT Assam has inducted 3(three) new ferry vessels & 4(four) Terminal Facilities of various capacities for different ferry ghats during last year. It is also anticipated to commission another 3(three) passengers vessels for various ferry services and 2(two) FRP (Fibre Reinforced Plastic) Catamarans between Guwahati and North-Guwahati to operate as Water-Taxi service within this current financial year.

<u>Strategic Development</u>: In view of infrastructure development on the river Brahmaputra and Barak the IWT Assam has also taken initiatives for procurement of another 56 (fifty six) new terminus pontoons and allotment of the works have been completed.

Meanwhile the Govt. of Assam has set-up "The Assam IWT Regulatory Authority" under the umbrella of Transport Department, Govt. of Assam to ensure safe, efficient, reliable and environmentally sound inland water transportation for the benefit of ferry users, freight consigners and water tourism in the State of Assam. To promote activities of water transportation, Govt. has also taken steps for formation of another 2(two) new companies namely 'Assam Shipping Company (ASC)' and 'Assam Ports Company (APC)'.

EAP Scheme: (Assam Inland Water Transport Project funded by World Bank):

The Assam Inland Water Transport Development Society under Transport Department has initiated the following actions:

- (i) An International Tender for procurement of 20 (twenty) nos. of state-of-the-art passenger ferry vessels for under the AIWT Project has been successfully awarded in Jan '20, making it one of the largest such order placed by Inland Water Transport departments in the entire North East region. In addition to the same the proposed introduction of 3 nos. of Tug boats, the 3 nos. of Search and Rescue (SAR) vessels and 3 nos. of Man over board vessels shall transform the fleet at the disposal of the IWT department.
- (ii) The Government decided to set-up a comprehensive River Information System (RIS) to determine, collate and disseminate all information relating to weather forecast, depth of water, navigational route etc. to all boat operators through GPS tracking device installed on board.
- (iii) Implementation of incentive based scheme "Jibhondinga" has been finalized where more than 1000 Marine Engines along with Life Saving Equipments etc. will be installed in the existing Private Mechanized Boats in tune with all requisite safety and regulatory norms.

Further, the Budget proposed under Revenue Component for the coming financial year 2022-23, to incur for both for salary & non-salary component which can expected to meet-up the actual requirement of fund for disbursement of salary of 3462 Nos. staff working under the IWT Assam as well as to maintain 96 ferry ghat within Assam.

ASSAM STATE TRANSPORT CORPORATION:-

Assam State Transport Corporation has been plagued since long primarily because of its vast work force vis-a vis the vehicles on road. Corporation is burdened with over aged employees comprises mainly of drivers and conductors. The average age of all regular ASTC employees are around 50yrs of age. ASTC issued notification dated 05.02.2022 inviting employees applying for YRS and out of them 332 Nos. of employees are found eligible for YRS. The estimated cost of YRS project is worked out at Rs. 9874.02 lakhs and it would reduce the monthly salary burden of ASTC by Rs 173.07 Lakhs per month which is about 24% of total monthly salary bills.

It is therefore requested that ASTC be provided a grant of Rs. 9 8.74 crore for the same.

ASTC has also been overburdened with the outstanding liabilities.

The total of CPF, Gratuity and Un-utilized Leave from January 2016 to March 2022 has been estimated at Rs. 14490.17 lakhs including the amount payable to EPFO on account of EPF liabilities from April, 2021 to March 2021 has been assessed to be Rs. 3 2 crores.

Therefore, the inclusion of the said amount aggregating Rs 144.90 crores in the next budget would ease the condition.

As regards to construction of ISBT at Bhairabkunda, Udalguri district, ASTC doesn't have any land and the matter is under consideration.

Transport

Observation and Recommendation

1. Commissionerate of Transport, Assam:

(i) The committee reiterates its earlier recommendation of consultation with the local MLAs for selection of schemes/ projects related to ASTC. The department should ensure involvement of the local MLAs.

2. Directorate of IWT, Assam

- (i) The committee reiterates its earlier recommendations for providing appropriate vessels to the following three water-courses:
- (a) Manikpur-Pamerchar,
- (b) Dongra-Kholabandha &
- (c) Moinbari-Goalpara town ghat via Tarakandi.
- (ii) The committee reiterates its earlier recommendations for survey and notification of the following water-courses under Baghbar LAC and
- (iii) for providing appropriate vessels in these water-courses:
- (a) Baghbar-Goalpara water course (river-Brahmaputra)
- (b) Dalguma-Chaysimana water course (river-Jaljali)
- (c) Uzirarchar-Dekdhuwa water course (river-Jaljali)
- (d) Morabhaj-Sheorachara water course (river-Beki)
- (e) Hadirachaki-(Tarakandi)-Pahartoli(Chatola) water course (river-Aie-Manas)
- (f) Milijuli-Koimari water course (river-Bhellengi)
- (g) Pub-Bhatnapaity-Paschim Bhatnapaity water course(river-Brahmaputra)
- (h) Chaysimana-Paschim Chaysimana water course(tributary of Brahmaputra)
- (i) Takakata-Sonabari water course(river-Brahmaputra)
- (j) Dighirpam-Shukhwarjhar water course(river-Brahmaputra)
- (k) Kokradangu Hatsingmari to Dhubri
- (1) Sukchar Dhubri (Bepari perah)
- 3. The Committee observes that due to lack of awareness of the "Mukhyamantrir Gramya Paribahan Achoni" people could not take the benefit of the Scheme. Therefore, the Committee recommends to make awareness programme so that the people can take the benefit of the Scheme and also to involve the local MLAs in every stage of implementation of the said scheme including selection of beneficiaries.
- 4. The Department in its earlier sitting had recommends that the local MLAs should be involved in every stage of implementation of the said scheme including selection of beneficiaries in consultation with the DC and the DTO. But the Hon'ble Members of the Committee opined that no MLA has been involved in this regard. Therefore, the Committee strongly recommends that strict action should be taken against the concerned officers for ignoring the recommendation of the Committee.
- 5. The Committee recommends to increase the passenger vessel in South Salmara, Mankachar, Goalpara and Dhubri District.

- 6. The Committee suggests the Department to provide modern comfortable buses and Bus stand at South Salmara-Mankachar District.
- 7. The Committee has observed that Electric Buses are highly efficient and have low operating cost than diesel buses. So, the Committee recommends Transport Department should procure new-model modern Electric Buses.
- 8. The Committee has observed that some officers are involved in collecting money illegally from goods Vessel in Tezpur District. Therefore, the Committee strictly directed the Department to initiate departmental enquiry and to take necessary action against the officer who are involved in it.
- 9. The Committee has observed that a proposal has been given for constructing a new helipad in Nagaon District which the Committee finds not very useful for the general public. Therefore, the Committee recommends to construct one Heliport instead of Helipad so that A TR under UDAN can be landed.
- 10. The Committee has observed that the Ro Ro and Ropax vessels which the Department has purchased could not be used in all the seasons. It could not be used in low water level. Therefore, the Committee recommends that the Department should purchase new Ropax vessels considering the water level of the Brahmaputra river.
- 11. The Committee has observed that due to dredging in the Brahmaputra river, some villages are suffering from huge soil erosion. Therefore, the Committee recommends that proper survey should be conducted and erosion factor also be taken into consideration while doing the dredging in future.
- 12. The Committee recommends the plight of Volvo Bus from Kokrajhar to Guwahati and also from Udalguri to Guwahati immediately.
- 13. The Committee recommends a connection of ferry service from South bank of Brahmaputra to Tezpur town.

The Committee recommends that the Budget allocation provided under Grant No.9 for the Financial Year 2022-23 for Transport be approved by the August House.

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
